Do you remember the feeling of settling into your first home? The pride you took in caring for the space and the intentionality of positioning your furniture and decorations in just the right places to make an empty house into a home?

When Octavia and her 3 year old daughter Omarea entered shelter at Family Promise, the idea of a permanent place to call home was furthest from her mind. "We were moving from house to house, and the people I trusted most put us out on the streets," Octavia shared. And living on her own and taking on the added responsibilities of managing a household were new to her.

"I love the Welcome Home program, because they (FP staff) helped me work through issues that kept me from getting a home, and helped me understand that by managing my money and paying my bills first, being responsible with my

money, I could do this." Octavia built confidence in her ability to afford a home on her own, in herself as a person, and that she can provide everything her daughter needs. "I can honestly say I am who I am today because of Family Promise."

Today, Octavia and Omarea are building their home. A quote on the living room wall reads 'Families who Pray Together Stay Together' and Omarea's preschool artwork, toys, and her cat Bella give the space the feeling of home. We are so impressed with Octavia's strength, resilience and persistence!
